RECYCLING RULES (CO-MINGLE)

Please follow these rules when you bring your recyclables to the transfer station:

- 1. All cans and jars must be washed out & clean.
- 2. Flatten all plastic jugs and containers.
- 3. All cardboard must be flattened 3' X 3'or less.
- 4. Newspapers must be bagged or bundled.

This is a free service to you and it is being greatly misused. Let's get it right so that we can maintain the service. Transfer Station Manager (Sandy) & both twp boards thank you!

Frequently Asked Questions (FAQs)

General – There are many other business that want your refuse – this list is not all-inclusive, nor is it intended to promote businesses that are named. These are some of the businesses that take recyclables or non recyclable items. Prices may vary so call/contact the listed vendor first. This listing is subject to change at any time and current at the time of posting. Our townships do their best to keep the environment clean.

- Q. What recyclable bins are available?
- A. 1. Scrap Metal Bin
 - 2. Co-mingle Bin Glass (jars, bottles), Cans (soup, veggie), Plastic (#1, #2, & #5), Paper (bagged or bundled), Cardboard (flattened or cut down no bigger then 3' X 3')
- Q. Does the transfer station accept regular light bulbs?
- A. Regular light bulbs are accepted and can be disposed of with your regular trash.
- Q. What about florescent light bulbs?
- A. There are no businesses in the area that accept florescent bulbs. We continually check to find out a means of disposal. Ask the Transfer Station Manager (Sandy) for any updates. The past year the county provided two plastic canisters available for county patrons to recycle **Only** Compact Fluorescent Lamps (CFL) bulbs at the courthouse and at the Stephenson Annex.
- Q. Where can I take TV's and other Electronic devices?
- A. Once a year there has been a County-wide collection point set-up usually between May and June. Also, ask the salesperson at where you buy your new electronics. That vendor may take your old items.
- Q. Where can I dispose of yard trimmings?
- A. No disposal place available at this time. Personal Compose Piles have been mostly used.

Q. Where Can I take a Refrigerator, Air Conditioner, or a Freezer?

A. Reliable on Hwy 180 Marinette for a cost (est. \$15.00). Everything must be intact. Rerun Furniture, see or call Ron Nerat at 863-6601, for a cost (est. \$25.00). In some cases pick-up is available.

For a running used refrigerators. WPS had a program where they would give you \$30.00 and pick it up – as long as they could come and hear it run. Call or talk to the Transfer Station Manager (Sandy) for additional information and if you need the WPS toll-free phone number.

Q. Where can I dispose of used tires?

A. Where you purchase your new tires is the best place to dispose of tires. Most places will charge an environmental fee. If you buy tires 'out-the-door' to install later, ask the vendor if they will take your old tires.

Q. Where can I dispose of used motor oil?

A. If you have your oil changed by a company/vendor; they will dispose of it and most times charge an environmental fee. Some places that take used oil in a container may charge a fee. Call ahead (partial list below).

Q. Where can I dispose of antifreeze?

A. Anywhere that does auto maintenance and best that it be the business that does your personal maintenance.

Q. Where can I dispose of batteries? (Auto, Marine, Cycle, Lawn Mower, and Household)

A. Reliable on Hwy 180 in Marinette.

Q. Other hazardous materials – Chemicals?

A. Once a year, there has been a County-wide collection point (was between May and June)

Q. Where can I dispose of my Non-Freon Appliances? (Washers, Dryers, Stoves)

A. Transfer Station – Free of Charge. Humidifiers and Fans may go in to the trash.

Q. Where do I bring scrap iron?

A. Transfer Station – Free of Charge Reliable Recycling on Hwy 180 in Marinette. (Various places pay you by the pound)

Q. Where can I dispose of a junk car?

A. Call Corey's Auto Salvage in Ingalls. They have a set scrap amount paid out to you.
